

Revelation 12 Sunday, May 16, 2021

The world would want you to doubt the existence of Satan; however, there is a real enemy. He has come to steal, kill, and destroy. (John 10:10) He is cunning and deliberate. We see evidence of his work is all over the place. There are destroyed lives, broken families, addiction, hurt, bitterness, and pain. Amidst that, there is hope. God's plan is for His children to be overcomers, even amid intense warfare.

Setting the Scene:

As well as being the start of a new major section, Revelation 12 stands as the theological heart of the book because it shows why the church faces spiritual hostility in this world and how God provides the victory. Revelation 12:1–14:20 forms a grand interlude detailing the cosmic conflict between God and the forces of evil, as well as God's vindication of his people and judgment of the unrighteous. In 12:1–13:18 we hear about the battle between the false trinity (Satan, sea beast, and earth beast) and the Triune God and his people.¹

- The Anti-Christ will be a future world leader who will promise to solve world problems. The False prophet will be the person who spreads his propaganda. For a time, it will look as if this evil is prevailing; however, we see Christ is victorious.
- This is a story of warfare and a defeated foe. He (Satan) knows his time is short.

We know that we are children of God and that the world around us is <u>under the control of the evil one</u>. 1 John 5:19

Three Figures to be aware of in the end times.

A Woman - This is Israel or God's people. (vs. 1-2)

• It was through Israel that Jesus Christ came into this world. In the Old Testament, Israel is often compared to a woman. (Is. 54:5, 66:7) In Revelation, the fallen world (apostate) to a harlot. (Revelation 17:1)

A Child - Jesus Christ, the Messiah (vs. 5-6)

- He is the Lion of Judah, our redeemer. This texted symbolizes his birth and ascension into Heaven.
- Wilderness (6) is place of protection. It is reminder God takes care of his people through difficulty.

A Dragon - Satan (vs. 3-4, 7-9)

- The color red is associated with death (Revelation 6:4) Also, seven heads symbolize completeness (whole world) and 10 cowns, perhaps 10 lings (Revelation 17:12-14)
- The dragon is cast out of Heaven (Vs. 9) and took with him a third of all the angels. (Stars)

¹² "How you are fallen from Heaven, O shining star, son of the morning! You have been thrown down to the earth, you who destroyed the nations of the world. ¹³ For you said to yourself, 'I will ascend to Heaven and set my throne above God's stars. I will preside on the mountain of the gods far away in the north. ¹⁴ I will climb to the highest heavens and be like the Most High.' ¹⁵ Instead, you will be brought down to the place of the dead, down to its lowest depths. - He tries to prevent the Messiah from being born. (King Herod, Matthew 2)
- 1. **Know Your Enemy**. (Revelation 12:7-8) Satan means adversary; devil means accuser.
- Satan Deceives Hold on to the truth.
- Satan Accuses Proclaim the Gospel.
- Satan Threatens Worship God almighty.
- Strategic in his attack

He **blinds** the minds of unbelievers. (2 Corinthians 4:4)

He **steals** God's words from you. (Matthew 13:9)

He **traps** you in order to ensnare you. (2 Timothy 2:26)

14 But I am not surprised! Even Satan disquises himself as an angel of light. 2 Corinthians 11:14

He **fights** to stop you (1 Thessalonians 2:18) He **plans** to destroy you. (1 Peter 5:8)

2. How Do You Overcome the Enemy? (Revelation 12:10-18)

The same serpent who accuses the saints in heaven also deceives ... the nations into thinking that the people of God are dangerous, deluded, even destructive.... God's people in every age must expect the world's opposition, but the church can always defeat the enemy by being faithful to Jesus Christ. Warren Wiersbe

The Blood of the Lamb (vs. 11)

¹⁹ For God in all his fullness was pleased to live in Christ, ²⁰ and through him God reconciled everything to himself. He made peace with everything in Heaven and on earth by means of Christ's blood on the cross. Colossians 1:19-20

- ✓ Our power is found in the cross of Christ.
- ✓ He cleanses us, forgives and releases us from shame.
- The Word of our testimony(vs 11). Something happens when we speak truth and declare who Jesus is.

⁹ If you confess with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. 10 For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by confessing with your mouth that you are saved. Romans 10:9-10
